



Dr. Juan Manuel ABRAS, PhD (born in Stockholm, Sweden)

Juan Manuel Abras (also written Jan Emanuel Abras), born in Stockholm (Sweden), is an international award-winning classical music composer, conductor, musicologist and historian who studied in Vienna, Germany, Italy, Poland, Spain and Buenos Aires. A student of Krzysztof Penderecki and Kurt Schwertsik, he also studied with Karlheinz Stockhausen, Helmut Lachenmann, Wolfgang Rihm, etc. A pupil of Leopold Hager, he also studied with Michael Gielen, Ervin Acél, Dominique Fanal, etc.
